

The download links have these versions:

- ePUB - need an ePub reader of some sort (like iBooks on the iPad / iPhone)
- Landscape PDF
- Portrait PDF

What you do depends on your device.

Note: We have discontinued the Kindle format. For more details, see the footnote.ⁱ

Windows PC:

Right click on the file link and select "save as" to download the file to your machine.

Select one of the PDF versions and read it in Adobe Reader.

To read an ePub on your Windows PC, you need an ePub3 reader - just Google: **Windows PC ePub3 reader** and select one of the readers to download and install. You may also be able to get an extension for your browser and read an ePub that way, just Google the name of your browser and epub, for example: **Windows PC Chrome epub3 ...**

Macintosh:

Command-click on the file link and select "save as" to download the file to your machine.

Select one of the PDF versions and read it using Preview on your Mac.

To read an ePub on your Mac, you need an ePub3 reader - just Google: **Mac ePub3 reader** and select one of the readers. You may also be able to get an extension for your browser and read an ePub that way, just Google the name of your browser and epub, for example: **Mac Safari epub3 ...**

iPad/iPhone:

The best option on an iOS device is to download the ePub version and read it in iBooks.

However, iOS can be picky about doing a download if you try to tap on the link directly - we find it works better if you tap and hold on the link, select copy, and then paste the URL into a new browser window works best. Your device will "spin" for quite a while during the download - just be patient, it will eventually come back and ask you if you want to open the file in iBooks or a different app.

We also find GoodReader does a great job managing the download if you copy the URL using a tap and hold, then go to the Connect section of GoodReader, select Enter URL and tap OK. Goodreader will download the ePub file and give you a download progress bar. Once the download is done in GoodReader, go to the Downloads folder to find the file, tap-and-hold, then on the buttons that show up, tap open in iBooks.

You can also use GoodReader to download and read one of the PDF versions, and then you can read it directly in GoodReader. GoodReader is a fabulous PDF viewer.

Also, for downloads if you want something other than GoodReader, try the iDownloader app. You won't ever want to download big files again in a browser after you see how smooth downloads on an iPad become with GoodReader or the iDownloader app.

Android device:

We prefer downloading and reading a PDF version on Android - use the landscape version on a 10" tablet, and use the portrait version on 7" tablets and smartphones.

Using ezPDF Reader Pro, you can easily download and open one of the PDF versions and read it directly on your device. For specific instructions, please Google your device name and the phrase "ezPDF download pdf".

To read an ePub on your Android device, you will need an ePub3 reader app. Just Google: ***epub3 reader for Android*** and select one of the reader apps.

Hope this helps you get the eBook onto your device and enjoy reading it!

Download links expiring or slow downloads

To avoid hackers finding the download links for an eBook and exploiting it to get free ebooks, all download links have a 4 day time limit. If the links expire before you get a chance to download your eBook, just email store@mrhmag.com and ask for fresh links.

If the downloads are going very slow (hours instead of minutes) and you otherwise have good bandwidth, on rare occasions we've seen our store servers can be routing via some odd hops over the

internet that are quite slow. If you email store@mrhmag.com and ask, we will give you links via a different server and that can often change the internet node mix and make a big speed difference.

If you are having problems downloading the files, you can also email office@mrhmag.com and ask for a data disk for an extra fee of \$3 plus postage.
